Project Description

Context and urgency: Since 2018, the well built by The Salvation Army has been the primary source of water for approximately 100 residents of the settlement and the staff of the community center. However, an official analysis conducted in April 2026 revealed dangerous levels of manganese, heavy metals, and microorganisms, posing a serious health risk (there have been recent cases of hepatitis in the area). Project objective: To install a water treatment system and ensure mandatory health monitoring for the first year to restore access to safe drinking water. Responsibility and ownership: The legal owner of the well and the water treatment system is The Salvation Army in Slovakia. The municipality refused to invest, as it is the organization's private property.

Community engagement and awareness: The project includes collaboration with the organization “Healthy Regions” to educate residents on safe water use and hygiene.

The project is directly linked to Slovakia’s strategic territorial plan, which focuses on improving the living conditions of marginalized Roma communities and protecting public health in areas where The Salvation Army operates. Ensuring access to safe drinking water in the Glejovka settlement is an essential prerequisite for achieving goals in the areas of social inclusion and basic humanitarian aid. Furthermore, a functional and safe water source is a legal requirement for registering our community center as a social service provider, thereby directly supporting the strategic presence and stability of our activities in the region.

We plan to cover the ongoing costs of mandatory health monitoring during the first two years primarily from HIVE funds. If this proves impossible, we will incorporate these expenses into our annual budget by reallocating other expenditures—that is, by

cutting spending in other areas. Starting in the third year of the project, we expect a systemic solution to the situation or more active involvement from the city, with which we will continue to negotiate this support.
